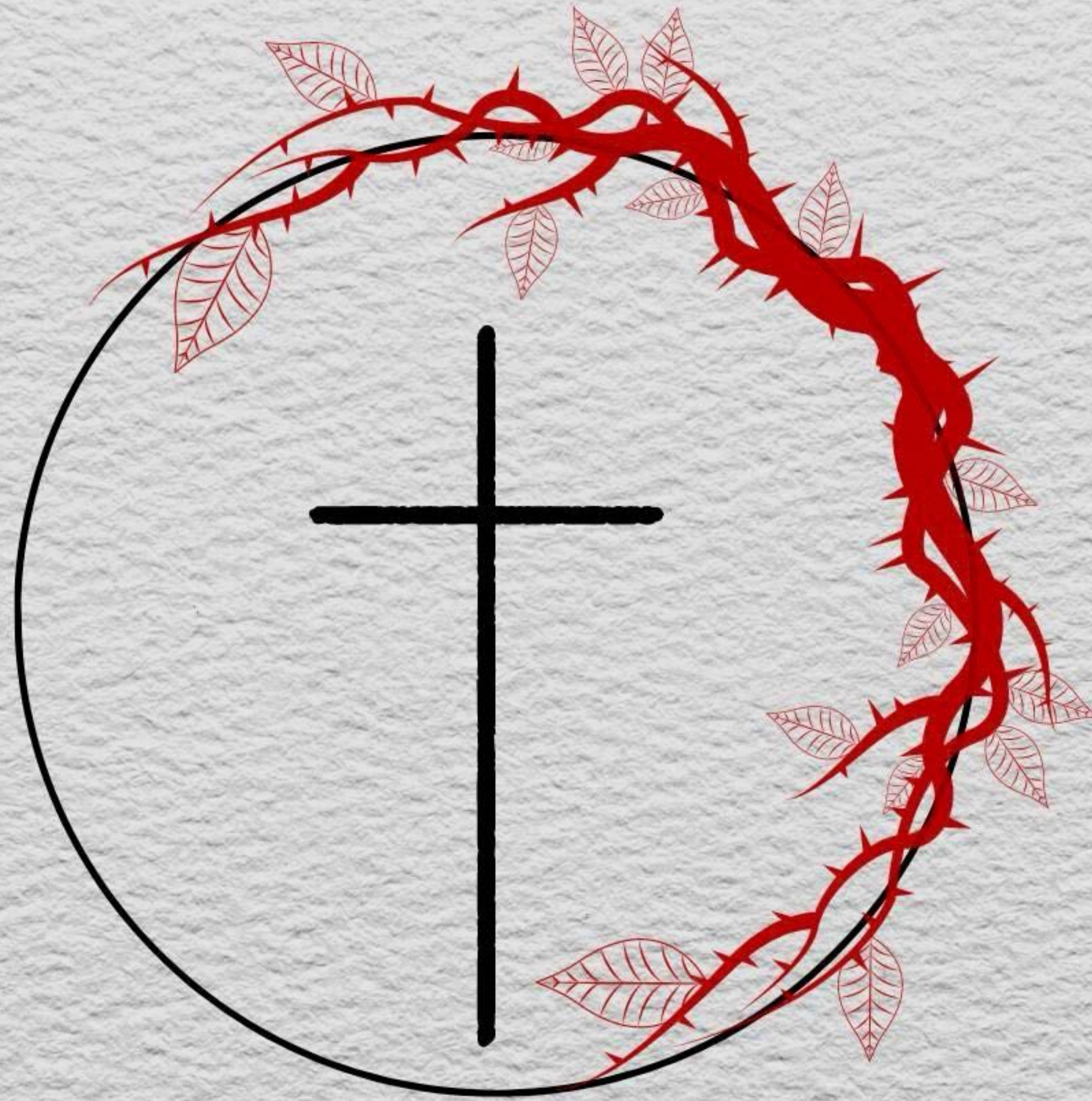

"UNHINDERED" AN INTRODUCTION TO THE BOOK OF ACTS (Chuck Swindoll)

"Unhindered." That's the very last word in the book of Acts. "Unhindered" is a fitting final word because it perfectly describes the central theme of Luke's historical account of the first-century church. That's not to say that the movement established by Jesus Christ and carried forward by His followers didn't meet with opposition. On the contrary, Acts describes opposition so ferocious and so deadly that any other organization would have folded immediately. "Unhindered" doesn't suggest that the first believers didn't experience challenges. They did, in fact, meet challenges so insidious, so unique, and so frequent that following conventional wisdom would have hastened their doom. "Unhindered" simply indicates that nothing would keep the church from fulfilling its divine purpose.

While Luke provides an accurate, detailed account of the first-century church and its spread across much of the known world, his book does not focus on ideas or events, or even the people who served and led the church. In fact, the usual title, Acts of the Apostles, could mislead readers; the book primarily recounts the actions of two apostles—Peter and Paul—though both were always in close cooperation with numerous gifted associates and ministry assistants. Perhaps a more apt title might be "Acts of the Holy Spirit." One of these Spirit-filled ministry associates, the physicalist, has assembled a grand mosaic using facts like colored bits of broken pottery to display the work of God as He carries out His plan to redeem and transform the world.

Acts is a vital link in the great narrative of God's redemptive plan. The Old Testament introduces God to humanity and establishes His covenants with Israel, all in anticipation of Jesus Christ. The Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—tell the story of how the God-man, Jesus, came to fulfill the Old Testament covenants and to establish a new covenant with humanity. Acts documents the launch of the new covenant community's phenomenal growth in the first three decades after Jesus' death and resurrection.

THE PURPOSE OF ACTS

Today, the books of the New Testament appear in a standardized order—Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, Romans, and so on—that separates Luke and Acts. But the book of Acts was never intended to be read as a stand-alone document; rather, it is the second volume of Luke's two-volume work, which began with his historical account of Christ's life, the Gospel of Luke.

Nevertheless, the book of Acts is well placed after the Gospels. It is a book of transitions, documenting the period after the earthly ministry of Jesus when the church

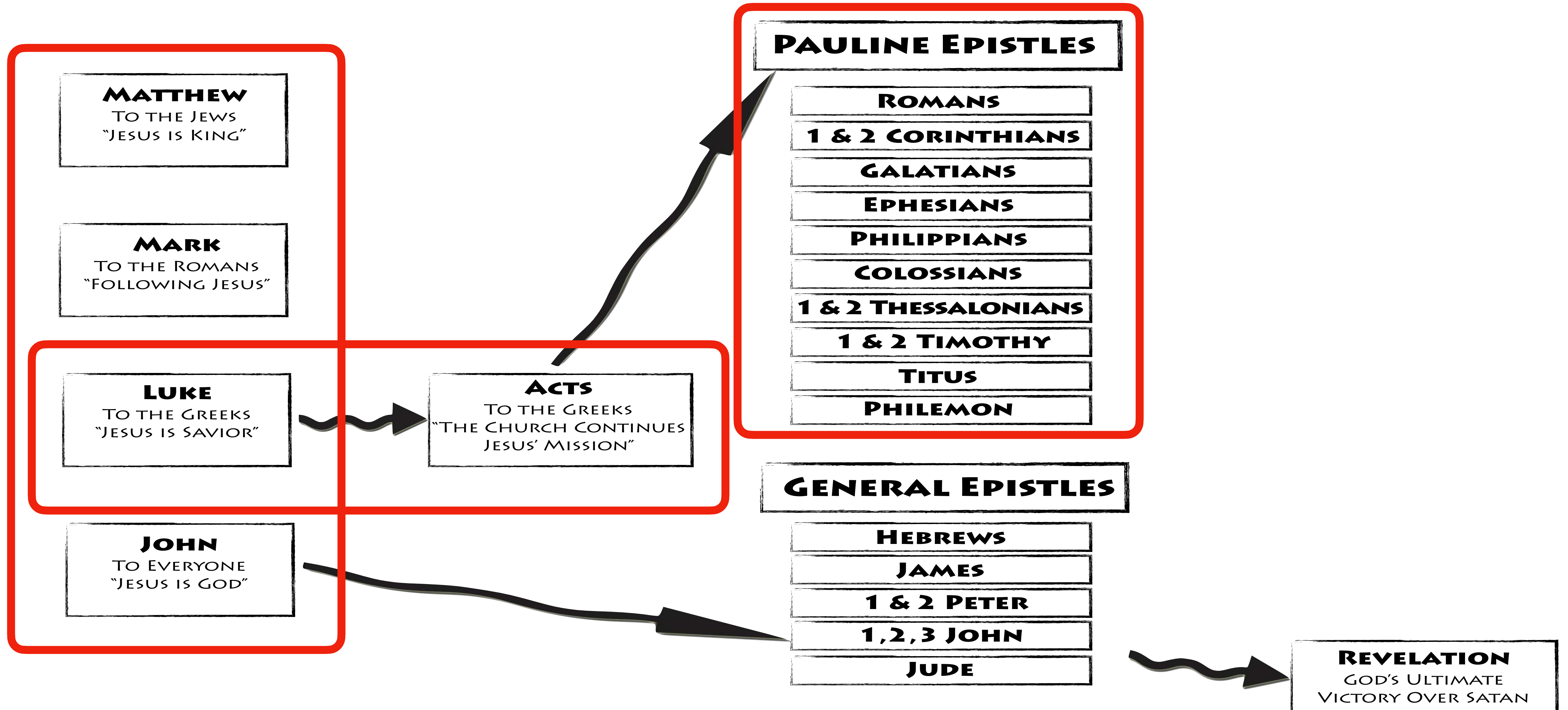

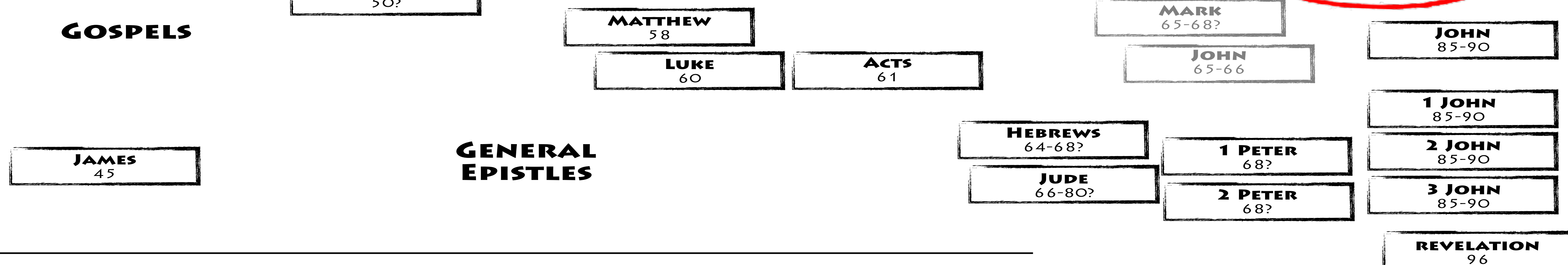
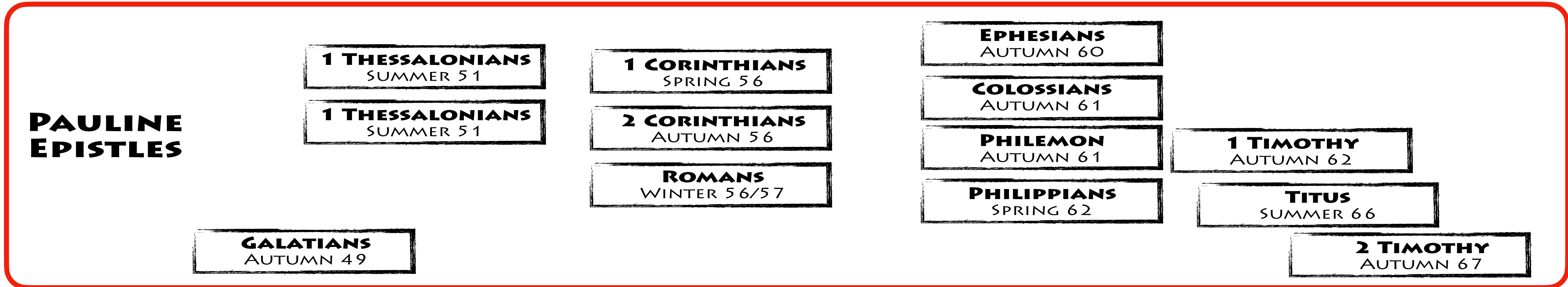

DIVISIONS OF THE NEW TESTAMENT

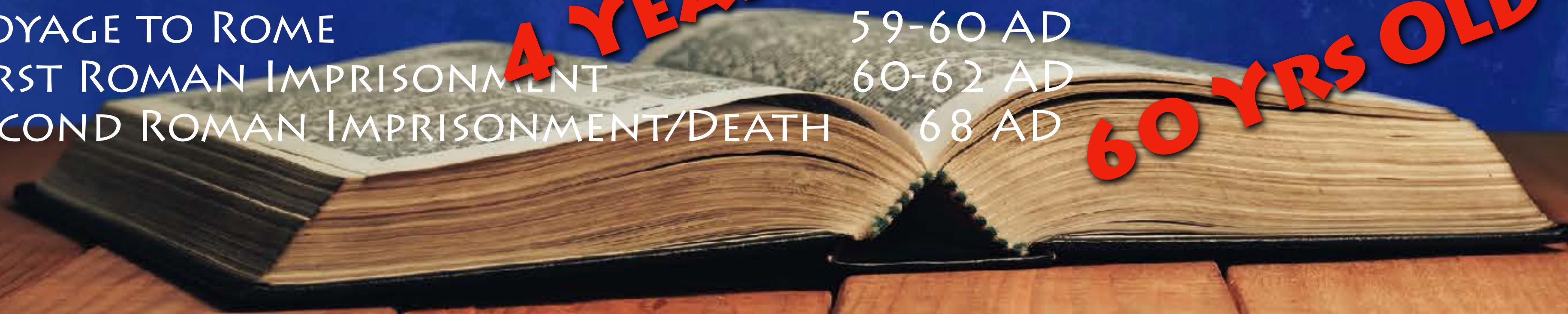

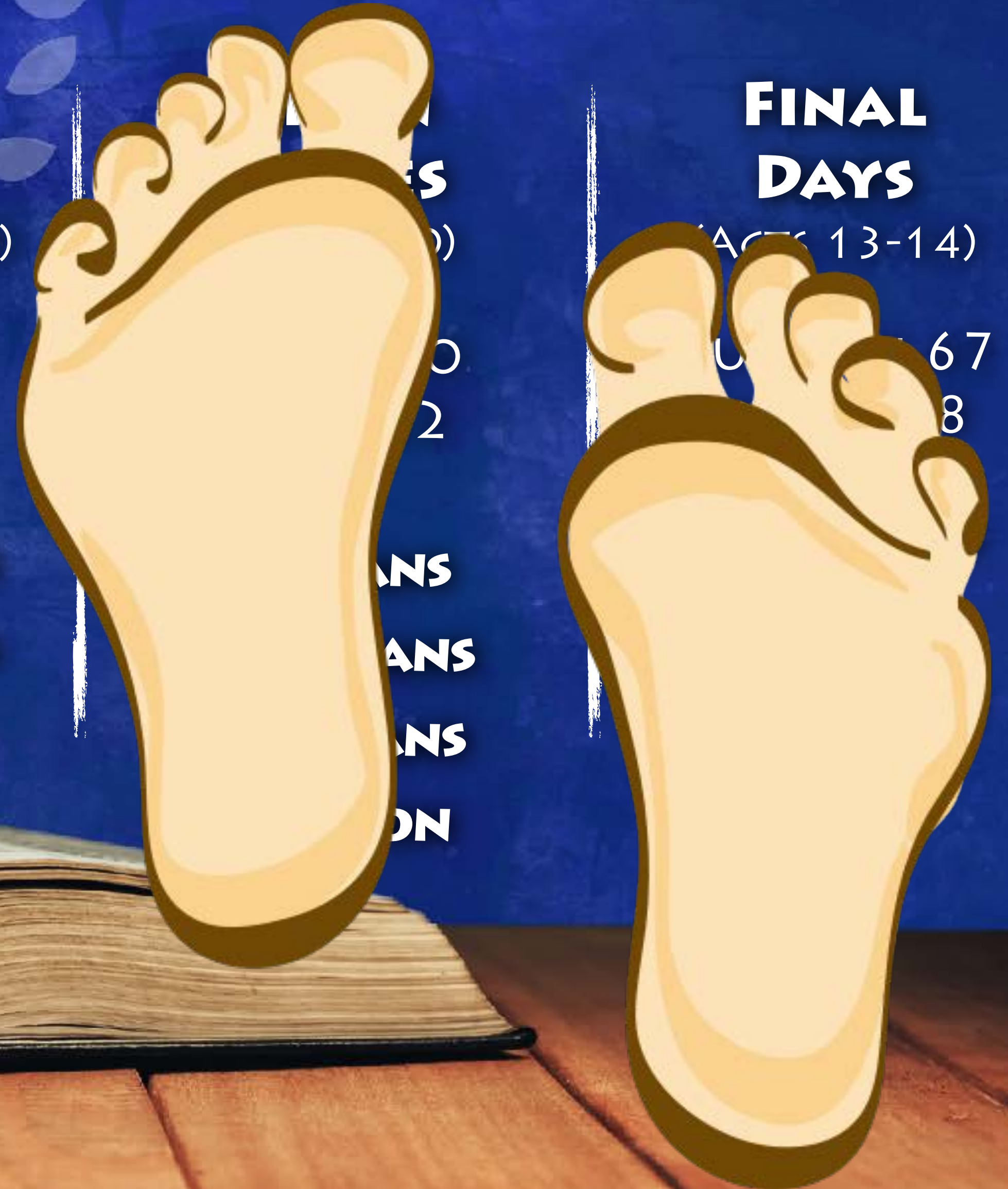

LUKE'S PURPOSE IN HIS GOSPEL CONNECTS DIRECTLY TO HIS PURPOSE IN ACTS. IN THIS TWO-VOLUME WORK HE EXPLAINS THE GRAND PLAN OF GOD THROUGH JESUS CHRIST AND HIS CHURCH (LUKE 1:20; 4:21; 9:31; 21:22, 24; 24:44—47). HE WRITES TO INSTRUCT THEOPHILUS AND OTHERS LIKE HIM SO THAT THEY MAY KNOW THE CERTAINTY OF THE THINGS THEY HAVE BEEN TAUGHT (LUKE 1:4).

IN OTHER WORDS, LUKE-ACTS PROVIDES A DISCIPLESHIP MANUAL FOR NEW BELIEVERS COMING FROM A PAGAN BACKGROUND AND LIVING IN A CULTURE THAT IS EITHER INDIFFERENT OR HOSTILE TO THE CHRISTIAN FAITH.

WHO COMPOSED ACTS?

LUKE IS CALLED “THE BELOVED PHYSICIAN” BY PAUL (COL. 4:14) WHICH LIKELY MEANS HE WAS MORE OF A PHARMACIST, HERBALIST OR HOMEOPATH IN HIS DAY. HE WAS NOT AN EYEWITNESS OF THE LIFE OF CHRIST BUT DID “CAREFUL RESEARCH” TO WRITE HIS ACCOUNT IN AN ORDERLY FASHION (1:1-4). HIS LITERARY STYLE SHOWS HIS EDUCATION. HE WAS A COMPANION OF PAUL AS SEEN IN THE “WE” PASSAGES IN ACTS (16:10-17; 20:5-15; 21:1-18; 27:1—28:16)



THE INTRODUCTIONS OF LUKE & ACTS

Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent **Theophilus**, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.

In my former book, **Theophilus**, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.



WHO WAS LUKE'S ORIGINAL AUDIENCE?

LIKE THE GOSPEL OF LUKE, ACTS WAS WRITING TO A MAN NAMED THEOPHILUS WHO WAS A REAL PERSON. HE IS CALLED "MOST EXCELLENT" (κράτιστε), A TERM USUALLY INDICATING SOME SORT OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL, OR AT LEAST HIGH SOCIAL RANK. HIS NAME IS GREEK AND MEANS "LOVER OF GOD." HE MAY HAVE BEEN A PATRON FOR LUKE PROVIDING FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR HIS RESEARCH AND WRITING.



WHO WAS LUKE'S ORIGINAL AUDIENCE?

WE DO NOT KNOW WHERE THEOPHILUS LIVED. HE APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN A FAIRLY RECENT CONVERT TO CHRISTIANITY. ALTHOUGH A REAL PERSON, HE REPRESENTS THE NEED FOR RECENT CONVERTS OF ALL TIME TO HAVE AN ACCOUNT OF THE LIFE OF CHRIST WHICH PROVIDES RELIABLE CONTENT AND RESULTS IN CONFIDENCE ABOUT THEIR FAITH AND CLARITY ABOUT THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH.



WHEN WAS ACTS WRITTEN?

IT IS LIKELY THAT ACTS WAS WRITTEN JUST BEFORE THE END OF PAUL'S FIRST ROMAN IMPRISONMENT (61-62) BECAUSE LUKE DOES NOT MENTION IMPORTANT EVENTS WHICH HAPPENED BETWEEN AD 60 AND 70. THE FALL OF JERUSALEM (66-70), THE PERSECUTION OF CHRISTIANS BY NERO (64), THE DEATH OF JAMES BY THE SANHEDRIN (62) AND ESPECIALLY, THE FINAL EVENTS IN PAUL'S LIFE INCLUDING HIS DEATH (64 OR 68).



WHERE WERE HE AND THE READERS?

LUKE SEEMS TO BE WRITING FROM ROME WHERE PAUL IS IMPRISONED AND WAITING FOR HIS DAY IN COURT. HIS PATRON, THEOPHILUS IS SOMEWHERE ELSE AND IT IS VERY LIKELY THAT LUKE IS WRITING FOR HIM WHILE AT THE SAME TIME COMPOSING A REPORT FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS.



WHY HIS ACTS WRITTEN?

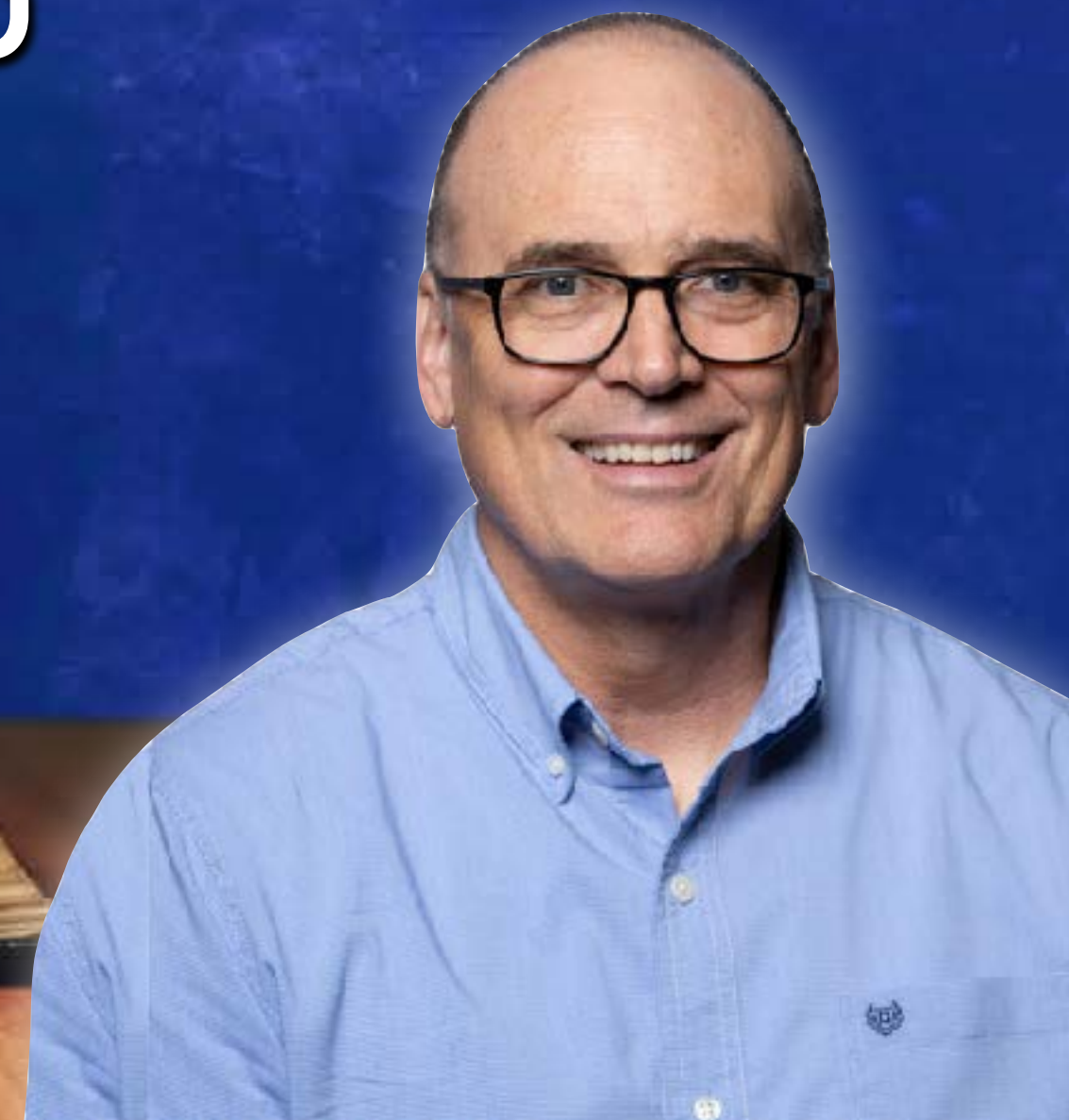
ACTS IS WRITTEN TO SHOW THE CONTINUITY BETWEEN THE MINISTRY OF JESUS, WHICH IS THE FULFILLMENT OF THE OLD TESTAMENT, AND THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH EMPOWERED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT.



LUKE'S PURPOSE IN ACTS COINCIDES WITH HIS PURPOSE IN THE GOSPEL OF LUKE. IN THIS TWO-VOLUME WORK, HE EXPLAINS HOW GOD HAS CONTINUED TO WORK OUT HIS REDEMPITIVE PURPOSES THROUGH THE CHURCH. WHAT JESUS STARTED, THE SPIRIT CONTINUES THROUGH HIS PEOPLE (ACTS 1:1-2).

Luke

1. Luke is called "the beloved physician" by Paul (Col. 4:14).
2. He wrote Luke & Acts to a Greek believer named Theophilus (Lk. 1:1-4; Acts 1:1-3) to clarify the gospel & its impact in the world.
3. Luke and Paul met in Troas where Luke joined Paul's mission effort (see Acts 16:8-11 & "we" in Acts 16:10-17; 20:5-15; 21:1-18; 27:1-37; 28:1-16).
4. He was a faithful traveling companion & doctor for Paul later in Paul's life (2 Tim. 4:11, Phm 24).
5. He was a faithful friend to Paul to the very end of his life (2 Tim. 4:11).
6. Literary style shows his education.
7. Historian & Theologian (Lk. 1:1-4).

The validity of the Global Christian Gospel is confirmed as Luke frequently uses the Old Testament standard of two or three witnesses for confirmation of truth (Deut. 19:15) by repeating themes & stories at critical places in Acts.

Luke, a companion and supporter of Paul's mission to the Gentiles, set forth the history of the followers of Jesus-empowered by the Holy Spirit-highlighting Peter, who opened the door of the gospel to the Gentiles, and Paul, who expanded the gospel to the ends of the earth, in order to demonstrate that the Global Scope & Mandate for the Gospel is not a new innovation but has always been the Ultimate Mission of God, Commission of Jesus and Priority of the Spirit.

WHAT IS THE MESSAGE?

LUKE, A COMPANION AND SUPPORTER OF PAUL'S MISSION TO THE GENTILES, SET FORTH THE HISTORY OF THE FOLLOWERS OF JESUS-EMPOWERED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT-HIGHLIGHTING PETER, WHO OPENED THE DOOR OF THE GOSPEL TO THE GENTILES, AND PAUL, WHO EXPANDED THE GOSPEL TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH, IN ORDER TO DEMONSTRATE THAT THE GLOBAL SCOPE & MANDATE FOR THE GOSPEL IS NOT A NEW INNOVATION BUT HAS ALWAYS BEEN THE ULTIMATE MISSION OF GOD, COMMISSION OF JESUS AND PRIORITY OF THE SPIRIT.
