
Stark contrast to Judges where "everyone did what was right in his own eyes."

A Bad Report

Now it happened in the month Chisley, in the twentieth year, while I was in Susa the capitol, that Hanani, one of my brothers, and some men from Judah came; and I asked them about the Jews who had escaped and had survived the captivity, and about Jerusalem. Know Who God is

I said, "Please, Lord God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps the covenant and faithfulness for those who love Him and keep His commandments:

Nehemiah 1:5

Know Who God is

Steadfast in love • Covenant honoring • Through thick and thin

Know Who you are

let Your ear now be attentive and Your eyes open, to hear the prayer of Your servant which I am praying before You now, day and night, on behalf of the sons of Israel Your servants, confessing the sins of the sons of Israel which we have committed against You; I and my father's house have sinned. We have acted very corruptly against You and have not kept the commandments, nor the statutes, nor the ordinances which You commanded Your servant Moses. Nehemiah 1:6-7

Know Who you are

Why run? Why turn away? Why hide? REPENT.

"Remember" is a repeated theme in Nehemiah. Remember has recall as well as action associated with it.

Asking God to remember His promises and act accordingly helps us to remember His promises and live accordingly.
