- What would it be like if you had nothing to look forward to in life? How hopeless do you think our world really is? Explain your answer.
- How can focusing on our future help us move through daily trials? In other words, how can hope help us now? Do we really let that happen?
- We often hear the saying, "where there is life, there is hope", but we can also say, "where there is hope, there is life." To what extent are you allowing hope to shape your life now? How can you let Hope play its full role in encouraging and strengthening you?
